## **Connecting with God and People – by Pastor David Piscatelli**

*NRS Acts 2:46-47 Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts,<sup>47</sup> praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.*

The scripture passage above describes the very first gatherings of believers in the days just after Jesus' death and resurrection. They continued to connect with God and one another. The disciples emulated what they had been taught. Jesus often sat down with them to have a conversation. They did not talk about the weather, sports, or politics; they discussed their understanding of God. Who is God? What does God expect? How does God interact with the world and more? We call the process of seeking to understand God, *theology*. When Jesus left them, the disciples began to share what they knew with anyone and everyone who would listen. They spent time with each other talking, eating, worshipping, and serving God. This was the beginning of the Christian Church – a process that has continued for almost 2,000 years!

Another process that has continued since the beginning of the Christian Church is the celebration of the Lord's Supper. One of the earliest practices of believers was to break bread and drink wine to celebrate the work of Jesus Christ on the cross. While there are many different denominations and religious practices, every Christian congregation celebrates Communion in one form or another. The first Sunday in October is World Communion Sunday, a date churches across the globe gather to connect with God and each other by celebrating communion. It is a reminder that we are not only connected to Jesus Christ, but we are also connected with believers all over the world who seek to be His disciples. Communion doesn't happen in our social circles or the political arena; it happens when Christians gather in remembrance of the life, death, and resurrection of Christ.

Today the church has become less attractive as a place to build community for others. Many people claim to be "spiritual" but have no faith formation groups to help them grow. Our communities have become our clubs, parents on our kids' sports teams, and work colleagues. In a time when we are so busy and conversations are a luxury, these social networks have replaced our church connections. They don't necessarily provide us with the opportunity to have honest faith-based conversations. They don't help us connect with God and others who are seeking to understand who God is and why God wants a relationship with us. Those conversations can only take place among other people of faith. Theology discussions can take place in Bible Studies, over the telephone, via email or online chat rooms, and even in local taverns. All you need is two or more people who want a deeper connection with God.

If your faith is deep and strong, perhaps you can share your journey with someone who is struggling. If your faith is hanging on by a thread (or that thread has already broken), perhaps now is a good time to search out a Christian friend for a conversation. The Bible is not a book of rules; it is a series of conversations by real people who have encountered the Living God, Risen Christ, and Empowering Spirit. If you need a place to start, Nichols UMC has several opportunities to connect with other believers on the next few pages for great faith-based discussions. I pray that by connecting with God and other people during these challenging times, that God will help us find those sources of support and love. ~Grace & peace, *Pastor David*

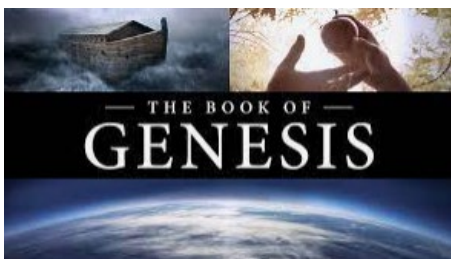
